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How I came out of the Trinity Doctrine

Since the summer of 2014 I have been seeking God like never before. After being in the world and knowing the truth that no one will live apart from Christ was and still is in my life. The doctrine of the trinity never was taught to me. Nor did I learn to believe in this since the moment I sought after God's precious grace and mercy. However, I did have a bit of confusion when praying to which Lord-Jesus or God; I was new to the faith. One year had passed. It was 2015 in the fall semester of College. God has amazed me and has answered all my questions and doubts about him, along with other things. Now, I remember hearing a sermon of Derek Prince, whom was one of the first favorite preachers I listened to. And when I heard a downloaded voice recording that was published on YouTube of Prince, for some reason when he said something like "If you do not believe that Jesus is God, then you are not saved" or "You are not a Christian". Now he followed with an "Um", then I do not remember what he said next. What I do remember is raising my eyebrows and in my mind I disagree with him. Then I had a thought in my mind that followed and reminded me of the Jehovah's Witnesses faith. JW's do not believe that Jesus is God, and yet I found myself identifying with the JW's in the same sense they have on Jesus-not whether Jesus was an angel, but about Jesus being God. And earlier in the year I think, I remember watching a debate on YouTube that had James White and a Modalist. Now, I was on White's side of the debate. For he defended the doctrine of the Trinity. However, I do not remember a single argument he put forth, even though I was staunch in the faith and contended for the truth, White's arguments did not stick with me. The modalist put forth arguments that I went against. I even remember taking a break to go to the restroom and I was saying in my mind "In the beginning was the Word! And the Word was with God! And the Word was God"! I guess that was my natural response. Yet I had no idea, to be honest, what John 1:1 meant after just reciting it. Then when I was finished with the debate, I did remember what the Modalist argued, shockingly. I remember him saying how "thousands upon thousands of times" God says that "I alone stretched out the heavens..." And I remember him quoting those scriptures from Isaiah where God speaks that He is one, that He was alone when he made the eons. I remembered his arguments, and yet I do not remember the Trinitarian's arguments. Now I had not changed or started to

question the Triune God doctrine until somewhere in November of 2015. I had a research project about famous celebrities. Now the project had a list of renowned people and celebrities. Now I did not want to cover a sports star, or an artist in pop music. Therefore, I chose Isaac Newton. For I knew that Newton had much knowledge of the Bible. And I knew that Newton believed in God-somehow I knew. When I watched a biography of Isaac Newton BBC presented a movie called "The Dark Heretic." Watching this documentary, and hearing the narrator, and the actor of Newton say that the Catholic Church corrupted the people's faith by their Hail Mary traditions, and when Newton condemned the Catholic Church about the doctrine of the Trinity, I changed forever.
